# Save the Rhino Trust Namibia - Overview

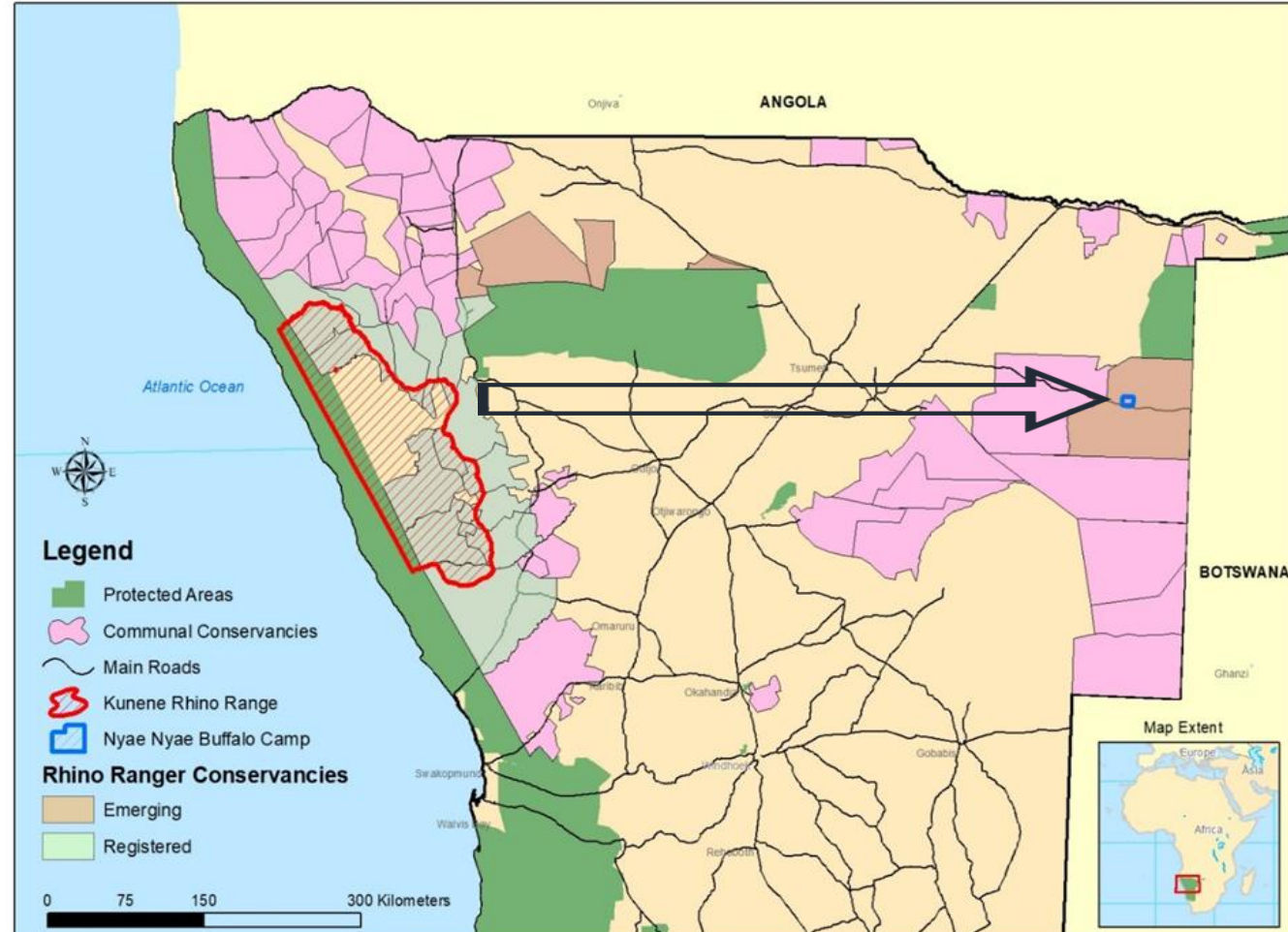


40 Years in Rhino

# Conservancy Rhino Ranger Programme

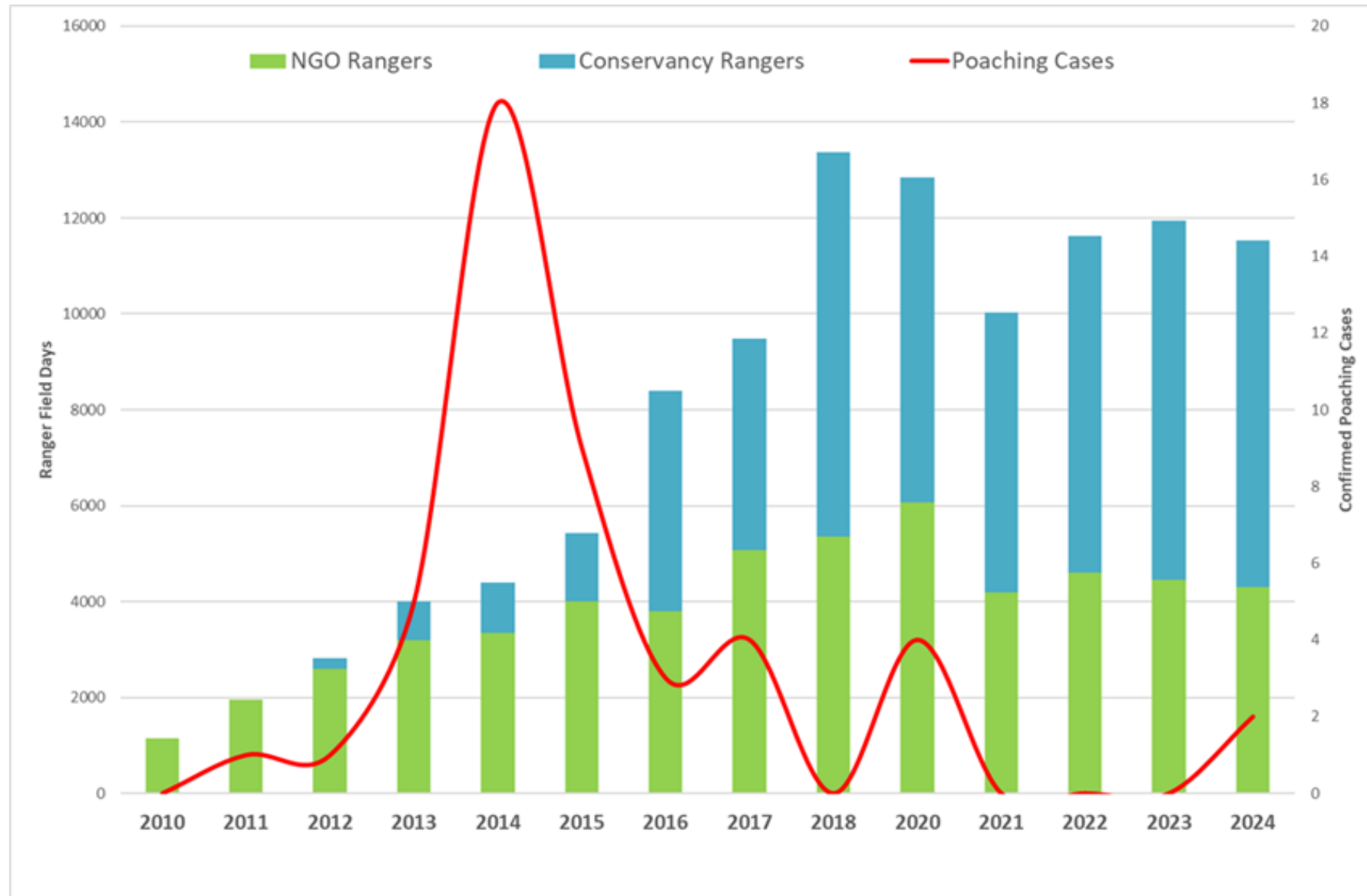
- SRT now supports over 70 rhino rangers including 13 female rangers – 14 Custodian conservancies
- 10 years of the CRRP
- Conservancy challenges remain
- More thorough engagement needed from SRT
